SHOW RULES

- 1. Exhibits must be staged by 11 a.m. on the day of the Show. The Hall will be open to exhibitors and their assistants only from 8:45a.m. until 11.00 a.m for staging. Judging will take place from 11:30 noon to 1:30 p.m.
- 2. All vases and other receptacles are to be provided by the exhibitor
- 3. All exhibits, personal property, etc., shall be at the risk of the exhibitors and the committee shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
- 4. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor All items entered must be home produced, home grown or home made RE-ENTRIES ARE NOT ALLOWED
- 5. Exhibitors may make only one entry per class. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with produce from the same garden or greenhouse. Exhibits must be entered in joint names.
- 6. It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that their exhibits are correctly labelled and entered in the appropriate class.
- 7. After staging no exhibit or part thereof may be altered or removed until 3.00 pm on the day of the Show
- 8. The decision of the judges shall be final on the relative merits of the exhibits but the Committee reserves to the referees and to itself the decision on any other points in dispute. Any prize may be withheld or modified if the exhibits are considered unworthy of the prize offered.
- 9. Prize Money will be paid following judging up until prize giving on the day of the Show. Please do not remove prize cards. Monies not collected by that time will be deemed a donation.
- 10. All entries will be awarded points: 10 for First, 8 for Second, 6 for Third and 2 for Highly Commended. The Peter Morgan Challenge Cup will be awarded to the overall lady winner, the JJ Cup to the overall gentleman winner and the Cradley Village Hall Cup to the overall family winner (A family shall consist of: at least 2 adults and one Junior exhibitor competing as individuals in the show). The Judges choice award will be made to the overall best produce exhibit.
- 11. The decision of the Committee shall be final regarding the eligibility of exhibitors and the refusal to accept any entry.

An Auction of exhibits will be held in the Hall from 3:15pm

Prizes for all classes: 1st £1.00, 2nd 80p, 3rd 60p.

FLOWER CLASSES

CLASS

- 1. One Perfect Rose: single flower in vase
- 2. Dahlias: one container 3 blooms of pompom variety (omit buds)
- 3. Dahlias: one container 3 blooms of cactus variety (omit buds)
- 4. Dahlias: one container 3 blooms, any other variety (omit buds)
- 5. Orchid Flower: One (any variety) in small vase
- 6. Hardy Herbaceous Perennial Plants: One container, not more than 4 varieties, not to exceed 750 mm overall space
- 7. Flowering House Plant: in container not to exceed 20cm
- 8. Foliage House Plant: any variety in pot container not to exceed 20cm
- 9. Cactus or Succulent: in pot not to exceed 20 cm, high or wide.
- 10. The Largest Sunflower Head

VEGETABLE CLASSES

- 11. Basket of mixed Vegetables: collected for the Kitchen (minimum 6 varieties in a basket no larger than 45 cm length)
- 12. Potatoes: 5, one variety
- 13. Carrots: Heritage Variety (multi coloured) 3 only
- 14. Carrots: 3 of one variety
- 15. Beetroot: 3 of one variety
- 16. Onions: 3 of any one variety
- 17. Leeks: 3 any variety
- 18 Parsnips: 3 any variety
- 19. French Beans: 6 pods
- 20. Runner Beans: any variety, no less than five stems
- 21. Tomatoes: ripe, minimum 4 on vine
- 22. Tomatoes: basket of Cherry tomatoes (any colours)
- 23. Squashes: basket of squashes
- 24. Shallots 6 of any variety
- 25. Chillies: 6 any variety
- 26. One display cucumber
- 27. Three Capsicums: any size any colour
- 28. Chard: 6 stems, rainbow
- 29. Cabbage:1 head
- 30. Longest Bean
- 31. Largest Onion
- 32. Largest Marrow
- 33. An Ugly Vegetable
