SHOW RULES

| 1 | Exhibits must be staged by 11am on the day of the Show. The Hall will be open to exhibitors and their assistants only from 8:45a.m. until 11.00am for staging. Judging will take place from 11:30am to 1:30pm. |
|----|---|
| 2 | All vases and other receptacles are to be provided by the exhibitor. All exhibits, personal property, etc., shall be at the risk of the exhibitors and the committee shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. |
| 3 | All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor All items entered must be home produced, home grown or home made. |
| 4 | Exhibitors may make only one entry per class. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with produce from the same garden or greenhouse. No exhibits to be entered in joint names. |
| 5 | It is the exhibitors' responsibility to ensure that their exhibits are correctly labelled and entered in the appropriate class. Entry labels are provided from the Show Office. |
| 6 | After staging no exhibit or part thereof may be altered or removed until after the prizegiving on the day of the Show. |
| 7 | The decision of the judges shall be final on the relative merits of the exhibits but the Committee reserves to the referees and to itself the decision on any other points in dispute. Any prize may be withheld or modified if the exhibits are considered unworthy of the prize offered. |
| 8 | Prize Money will be paid following judging up until prize giving on the day of the Show. Please do not remove prize cards. Monies not collected by that time will be deemed a donation to the Village Hall Charity funds. |
| 9 | All entries will be awarded points: 10 for First, 8 for Second, 6 for Third and 2 for Highly Commended. The <i>Peter Morgan Challenge Cup</i> will be awarded to the overall lady winner, the <i>JJ Cup</i> to the overall gentleman winner and the <i>Cradley Village Hall Cup</i> to the overall family winner. |
| 10 | A family shall for the purposes of the competition, consist of 4 people of any age identifying under a family name- each person competing individually in at least 4 classes according to the rules for entries in Rule 4 above. |
| 11 | Juniors (16 and under) may enter any class and will be awarded points as in Rule 9 above. The junior entrant with the highest number of points will be awarded the FOCS Cup. Entry for juniors is FREE and no monetary prizes will be awarded. |
| 12 | The decision of the Committee shall be final regarding the eligibility of exhibitors and the refusal to accept any entry. |
